Proclaiming the Mystery of Faith 2023-2025: This is the headline title for



the three-year programme that started in the diocese in 2023. **2024 will be kept as a Year of the New Testament** (2023 was the Year of the Old Testament).

These will prepare us for a special Year of Faith in 2025 which marks both 1700 years of the Council of Nicaea and 950 years of Christian mission in the diocese based in Chichester.

The Bishop of Chichester, Dr Martin Warner, welcomes 2024 as the Year of the New Testament in a podcast interview with Rob Marshall. Bishop Martin looks at how viewing the characters and stories associated with the Old and New Testament, through a series of lenses across the ages, has enriched the text. He also talks about the Diocesan Lent course for 2024 and reveals his favourite gospel and why.
