All welcome.


Meet old and make new friends over homemade cakes and fresh coffee. No charge but contributions towards expenses will be gratefully accepted.

Study – deepening our understanding of God.

A highly recommended read this Advent...

O Come Emmanuel – Reflections on the Advent antiphons: This beautifully illustrated Advent companion explores the ancient biblical names and images for the coming Messiah.

Well-known writers offer a total of 24 reflections, one for each weekday of the four weeks of Advent. The writers each offer three reflections on one of the seven antiphons: O Wisdom, O Adonai, O Root of Jesse, O Key of David, O Morning Star, O King of the Nations, O Emmanuel. Lastly, there are three reflections on the Magnificat – Mary's Song. Each day includes the text of the antiphon from Common Worship, a Scripture reading exploring its biblical roots, paintings of the antiphon as a focus for meditation, a reflection, a challenge to ponder and an Advent prayer. Advent Calendars: If you are thinking about how you can share the Good News with your children, or grandchildren, then do check out the Real Advent Calendar. (https://meaningfulchocolate.co.uk). Behind each of the 25 windows there is a Fairtrade Chocolate (30% cocoa and Palm oil

free) and a line from the Christmas story with colourful matching picture. It comes with a free 24-page Christmas story activity book designed to be used every day in Advent. On the website you can also purchase one to go directly to a food bank and buy other Christmas treats.
